Father Gregg Announcements:

Father has been busy with the Renew My Church efforts and meetings associated with making the grouping more effective. Our Vicariate is likely to be more active with implementation come 2020.

The *To Teach Who Christ Is* campaign is doing well. We are at ~\$950,000 collected so far. We anticipate enough funding coming in for the HVAC project for the school. Pre-planning continues, archdiocese approval of the plans is anticipated, and we are on pace to have it completed before the 2019-2020 school year begins.

Annual Catholic Appeal target will be a 7% goal (about \$65,000) to the archdiocese. Additional funding that is received will revert to St. John the Evangelist. This goal is set by the archdiocese and is 1% higher for this next campaign based on new strategic planning based on parishes.

Polish school started in September. There have been concerns about them using our facilities. They are paying a fee to St. John for the usage. Current contract is for one year period and will be re-evaluated for any future use. It has been an overall success and has led to an enrollment in the school as well as another enrollment in Religious Ed.

Gala is coming up in November.

Principal Notes:

Enrollment is steady. There is a new 8th grader who recently transferred from a U-46 school.

The Facebook challenge is starting to wrap-up. It has been successful with lots of pictures being sent in. Anyone who has sent in a photo by Friday will receive a Dress Down Day pass.

AdvancEd has been working with the school to have all the paperwork current and ready for accreditation.

Coverage for Mrs. Sekoguchi's maternity leave is almost finalized. The last approvals are pending.

All teachers and Mrs. Billmeyer will be attending the NCEA conference. It is being held in Chicago for the first time in years. The conference will be held after Easter: April 23-24.

The Vajgrt Family had four boys attend St. John's 10 years ago and has recently donated \$1000 to the school. His company, Northrup Grumman, has matched that donation. The Knights of Columbus, Ladies Auxillary and PTC will contribute the remaining amount needed to purchase a new Smartboard for the school. This purchase will be the third Smartboard for the school.
